

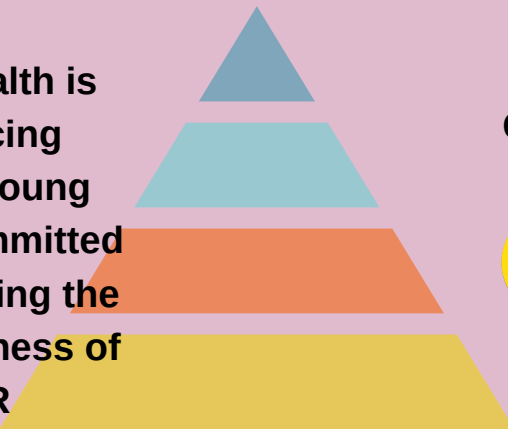

Looking to apply for some big time grants? Here are some helpful tips to make sure nail your grant application!



Always remember the 3 C's - Clear, Concise and Compelling



Map out your goals before completing the application. Ask yourself "what am I trying to accomplish with this grant?"



Storytelling is KEY! Don't be afraid to convey emotions and provide data to help tell your own story



Proofread, proofread, proofread - have a friend proofread and give feedback (spell check as well)



Don't overdo it! Use your instincts - if you think its too long/short - its probably too long/short!



Where can I find more grants as a provider?



It depends on what you need and what you are looking for! (Not all grants come in money form - in kind grants are always a good way to keep spending costs down)

- Books
- Continuing Education
- Nature
- Art/Science/Math Specific
- Physical Education
- Social/Emotional

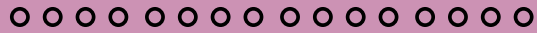


Think outside the box on where to find what you need! (examples)
